In mid-June, Nazarenes from around the globe gathered in Indianapolis, IN, for the 30th General Assembly. Sunday morning's worship service brought together more than 12,000 people from over 160 nations in person, not to mention the thousands watching online. As part of the convention there was an exhibit hall that showcases many ministries, other religious organizations, universities and colleges. One of the booths was Nazarene Camping Association, of which Trinity Pines is a member. The display featured a map showing the 35 camps in the USA/Canada. While I was there, I learned that two of the camps will be closing their doors this year. That was concerning to me, since Rev. Stan Reeder, Regional Director for the USA/Canada Region, had just reported a 13% drop in church membership since the last assembly. This was alarming to many, but thanks be to God that other regions of the world continued to increase in numbers.

Christian summer camp experiences have been in the business of changing lives since their beginning and Trinity Pines is no exception. Even this summer, we have seen new stakes driven in Stake Garden to demonstrate a foundation for Christ in the life of a camper. As registrations were processed for summer camps, we heard stories of outreach to unchurched students who were being invited to join a Nazarene summer camper. I have heard NNU tout that Trinity Pines is the largest feeder of freshman students of any camp on the educational region including OR, WA, ID, MT, WY, UT and AK.

While we celebrate the countries around the globe that the Church has entered through missionary work, we must also recognize what is happening in our own backyard. We know our country needs a strong spiritual foundation to address many problems facing our nation. It is going to take opportunities for young people -- the future leaders of our communities, nation, and world -- to hear the message of Jesus to make this happen. Camps are not just about fun, games, new friends, and getting away from home; they are about an opportunity to hear God's voice for the first time or in a different way and then responding.

While there are constant challenges that we must face in operating a camping program, praise the Lord for strong, faithful partners like YOU who are helping sustain the camp for this very mission. Summer 2023 was a life-changing experience for campers because of your support, generosity, and prayers. I can assure you that Trinity Pines is not on the list to close and accept a continuing trend of decreased attendance. We are dedicated to growing the church and the Kingdom of God and your partnership with us is vital to that mission.
