LET'S MOVE ON THE NEW RESTOOM FACILITY

For about a year now we have been sharing with you about the new restroom facility as part of the Elk Valley project. Initially estimated to be around \$600,000 that figure is now around \$650,000-\$670,000 depending up on the availability of volunteer labor when it is time to build. We have raised \$162,808 for the project to date. I will recap why this restroom project is important to us:

- 1. Renovation of the 7 bunkhouses has extended use of those sleeping facilities into marginal months (April-October).
- 2. The bunkhouses initially were to use the restrooms in the three lodges which are in similar proximity. However, this has produced a higher than usual demand on the restrooms in the lodges and some complications.
- 3. It will replace portable toilets that are being used to service the amphitheater, worship tent, recreational fields.
- 4. By design, it will meet some special needs that we have at camp for specific campers.
- 5. It is two story, and housing above the facility will be available for summer staff and volunteers.

Enclosed or attached you will find a pledge/donation card for the restroom project. Is it glamorous? Is it exciting? Probably not, but it is necessary and valuable to camp operations. I hope that you will join us as we work to reach over \$300,000 enabling us to approach the Murdock Foundation for matching funds. Let's move the new restroom facility project to the top of our list and work toward completion in the next few months so our guests can start benefiting from the investment.

APRIL 15: The deadline for early bird registration is Monday, April 15th (same as Tax Day). We are getting good reports on how easy the new registration program (Camp Wise) is to navigate. If you have specific questions, please call the Trinity Pines office at 208-382-6200 and visit with Lois.

BUS TO CAMP: Yes, there will be a bus leaving from the Mountain West Bank parking lot at The Village in Meridian heading to Trinity Pines for the following camps: Sr. High, Kids Camp, and Jr. High. The bus will also be returning on Friday. The cost to ride the bus is \$30 camper either one way or roundtrip. **NOTE**: Be sure to check with your local church to see if they are providing different transportation.

VALLEY COUNTY PROPERTY TAXES: Idaho citizens have enjoyed some reduction in property tax assessments in the past few years. However, this has had a major finajical impact on local taxing districts to raise the revenue that they need to operate county and local services, facilities and employees. Valley County is no exception. Last year, Trinty Pines received a large, complicated document asking us to justify operations in order to maintain our tax exempt status. The document was completed and filed and we were granted an exemption. In February, we received a new document for this year with an expanded request for documentation and more explanation. We are not alone, there are around 40 different types of camps that operate in the Valley County area. Thanks to Brent Deakins, Assistant Superintendent; Gerron Gibson, Trinity Pines Board; and Randy Peterman, legal counsel, we are finalizing the packet for the commissioner's review. Please pray that an outcome will be in our favor and the exemption will be granted for this year. Paying taxes on the nearly 200 acres at Trinty Pines would greatly impact our bottom line resulting in increased costs to users of the camp.

WE WERE NOT EXCITED: We received the resignation of Food Service Manager, Christiaan Goldberg, effective June 7. Christiaan, her husband Keith, and children will be returning to Texas to allow Christiaan to care for her ailing mother. Keith has been a teacher in the Cascade School District, so this is also a loss for their faculty. Administrator John Theien went right to work looking for a replacement acknowledging the critical timing of this departure with the start of summer camps. An interview will take place on April 12-13 that looks promising. We are also searching for Assistant Cooks that might live in the area or want to work during the summer. Ashley Hodges that has been an assistant cook will also be leaving the staff at the same time as Christiaan to expand her cleaning business and care for her children.

FARMHOUSE REMODEL: We are waiting on Mother Nature (we had several inches of snow again this week) to be in our favor to start construction on the Farmhouse expansion and renovation.
