Pave the Way provided an opportunity for individuals, couples, families, churches, businesses, etc., to have a brick engraved and be placed in the walkway. Each paver cost \$250 and can be inscribed with whatever you desire. It is a great opportunity to have a legacy at the camp that shows your support of Christian camping and specifically Trinity Pines. We invite each unit providing a paver to send us your story that will be bound in a book placed in the conference center for others to read. Our granddaughters find great delight in arriving at camp and going to find their bricks that were gifted and installed when they were very young. This will be the first year that our oldest granddaughter is eligible to attend Genesis Camp and I am sure each time she walks on that path and sees her name on a paver, she is going to be excited. The hope is that the writing in the book will talk about your engagement through the years with camping, perhaps at Trinity Pines or it may be that your story starts at a camp in another state or at our prior camp, Victory Cove. The stories that are behind the pavers have been words of encouragement and often relay the spiritual journey that a person was on during their time at a Christian camp. We have some limitation, based on freezing of the ground, as to when we can install bricks but now is the time of year that we can continue the process. Our goals it to eventually have a pathway paved with bricks all the way to the main road (Krazter Way) that runs through camp. SOMETHING IS A LITTLE DIFFERENT THIS

YEAR: We are approaching the medical staffing at our camps a little different this year. Instead of having only one medical person for the entire season, we are going to have a different medical person(s) at each camp. This makes for some greater efficiencies when it comes to ages of campers attending that camp. Some camps, based upon size, will have more than one medical person on their team.

RESTROOM FACILITY: We continued to be blessed by financial gifts towards the construction of the new restroom facility/staff housing in Elk Valley. We are past the \$180,000 mark in our goal of \$300,000 to apply for a Murdock grant for construction. If you want to help towards this project, be sure that you designate on your donation that the funds are to go to the restroom project. Our goal is to be ready to start construction in the fall of 2024 or the spring of 2025. This will be based upon the flow of funds and whether or not we qualify for the grant.

DONATIONS OF ITEMS TO CAMP: I want to remind those who offer to donate an item to camp, the item donated may be used, traded, sold or trashed. You, as the donor, will still receive a donation letter for your taxes, but the camp reserves the right to make the choice as to the best use and future of the donation.

LOWELL ROWLEY: Lowell Rowley was the first man to work on the Trinity Pines property. Lowell owned a excavation company and began the development of Trinity Pines in 2000 with equipment to build roads and to excavate the space into the mountain for the conference center. Recently, on a trip to Visalia, CA, Lowell suffered cardiac arrest, which resulted in a triple bypass surgery in Visalia where he remains today and will for a period of perhaps two more weeks. FARMHOUSE CONSTRUCTION HAS STARTED:

The excavation was done this week for the expansion to the farmhouse. This was the original building on the property. This past week the building was jacked up for new floor joists and also the foundation repaired in some areas. Now the living space will be expanded, as well as adding a garage. RIDE THE BUS TO CAMP: The bus will originate out of the Village Parking lot by Mountain West Bank on Monday mornings of 4th-6th Grade Camp, Jr. High and Sr. High Camp. An adult chaperon will be on the bus and will send texts through a special app to the adult responsible for the campers, so you will know when they arrive in Cascade on Monday. The same process will occur to say when they leave camp, when they pass through Horseshoe Bend and through Eagle so you can be at Mt. West Bank for pickup of campers. The cost to ride the bus one way or roundtrip remains at \$35.
