## VALLEY COUNTY PROPERTY TAX - UPDATE

The hearing before the Valley County Board of Examiners (BOE) took place on Friday, June 28. Attorney Randy Peterman was before the BOE for about an hour presenting the case of Trinity Pines. The County Assessor provided justification for the 157 days of rentals deemed as commercial for which property taxes (\$29,650) were assessed. The Assessor claims that unless the camp is being used by the owner (Nazarene groups), it is subject to property tax.

When it was all done for the day, the BOE moved their final decision to Monday, July 8 and indicated they would like to consult with their legal team on the appeal. We cannot determine if this is good news, bad news or just a stall factor for further discussion. We appreciate your prayers in this matter.
